SUMMARY

Issue for Decision (Consent Agenda)

Should the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions and degree conferrals as listed on the attachment?

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are six licensing petitions and 31 requests for the conferral of the degree of Doctor of Medicine for review and determination.

24-119-60 Georg Clemens Rohe Oldenburg, Germany

(Westfalische Wilhelms-Universitat Munster, Munster, Germany, Arztliche Prufung, Certificate of the Medical Licensing Examination, December 1994)

Petition for: Endorsement of applicant's medical license from Germany.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Dr. Rohe lacks three years of accredited postgraduate training. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Rohe's application. He recommends that Dr. Rohe's training be accepted as the equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the license, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for New York State licensure by endorsement. Dr. Rohe obtained his medical license in Germany in 1996. His German license is active and in good standing. Additionally, Dr. Rohe holds a Diplomate of the European Academy of Anaesthesiology certification, European Diploma in Anaesthesiology and Intensive Care and he also holds a European Diploma in Intensive Care Medicine.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Rohe's German license be endorsed, and his Diplomat certification in Anaesthesiology and European Diploma in Anaesthesiology and Intensive Care and European Diploma in Intensive Care Medicine be accepted to fulfill the proficiency and clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

<u>Petition for</u>: Endorsement of applicant's medical license from Israel.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Dr. Vaxman lacks three years of accredited postgraduate training. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Vaxman's application. He recommends that Dr. Vaxman's training be accepted as the equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the license, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for New York State licensure by endorsement. Dr. Vaxman obtained her medical license in Israel in 2017. Her Israeli license is active and in good standing. Additionally, Dr. Vaxman holds ECFMG certification, a specialist degree certification in Internal Medicine, and a specialist degree certification in Hematology.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Vaxman's Israeli license be endorsed, and her specialist degree certifications in Internal Medicine and Hematology be accepted to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for endorsement.

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
