SUMMARY

Issue for Discussion

Should the Board of Regents adopt the proposed amendment of section 3.2(a)(6) and 3.2(d)(6) of the Rules of the Board of Regents relating to a standing committee name change?

Reason for Consideration

Review of policy.

Proposed Handling

The proposed amendment is presented to the Adult Career and Continuing Education Services (ACCES) Committee for discussion at the January 2025 Regents meeting. A copy of the proposed rule (Attachment A) is attached.

Procedural History

A Notice of Proposed Rule Making will be published in the State Register on January 29, 2025, for a 60-day public comment period. Supporting materials are available upon request to the Secretary of the Board of Regents.

Background Information

The standing committees of the Board of Regents are identified in 8 NYCRR 3.2. The Department seeks to conform to the Rules of the Board of Regents regarding the recent reorganization of the Department's Offices of Special Education and ACCES. To promote collaboration and greater customer service, the Department has unified these

program offices under a single Deputy Commissioner and a single name: the Office of Special Education and ACCES (OSEA). The proposed regulation updates the name of the ACCES committee to the Special Education and ACCES (SE-ACCES) committee to reflect this change.

It is anticipated that the proposed amendment will be presented for permanent adoption at the May 2025 Regents meeting, after publication of the proposed amendment in the State Register and expiration of the 60-day public comment period required under the State Administrative Procedure Act. If adopted at the May 2025 meeting, the proposed amendment will become effective on May 21, 2025.

(iv) reviews and approves amendments to the Rules of the Board of Regents and Regulations of the Commissioner of Education relating to adult education and workforce development, vocational rehabilitation, and proprietary school supervision; and

(v) seeks input from the public and professional field on policies and practices concerning adult education and workforce development, vocational rehabilitation, and proprietary school supervision.
