SUMMARY

Issue for Decision (Consent)

Should the Board of Regents approve the appointment of a member to the New York State Teachers' Retirement System Board?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State statute.

Proposed Handling

This issue will come before the Full Board at the September 2024 meeting, where it will be voted on and action taken.

Procedural History

Appointment of certain members to the 10-member board of the New York State Teachers' Retirement System (NYSTRS) Board requires approval by the Board of Regents.

Education Law §504(3) provides that:

"...A vacancy occurring during a term in the case of a member elected from among the active members of the retirement system shall be filled, until the next annual convention of delegates, by the commissioner of education..."

Background Information

Appointment under Section 504(3) of the Education Law:

In accordance with the provision of Education Law §504(3), the New York State Teacher's Retirement System (NYSTRS) forwarded the name of an individual for consideration for appointment to the Board until the next annual convention of delegates, following the resignation of Board member Elizabeth Chetney on March 17, 2024.

The NYSTRS and the New York State United Teachers (NYSUT) recommend the appointment of Donald A. Little III who is an active member of the NYSTRS from the Syracuse City School District. Mr. Little meets the requirements stated in Education Law §504 and has been recommended after an extensive statewide candidate search and screening process conducted by NYSUT. Copies of letters from the NYSTRS and NYSUT recommending Mr. Little (Attachment A) are attached. Mr. Little's resume (Attachment B) is also attached.

Related Regents Items

Not applicable.

Recommendation

The Department recommends that the Board of Regents take the following action:

VOTED: That the Board of Regents appoint Mr. Little to the NYS Teachers' Retirement System Board pursuant to Section 504(3) of the Education Law until the next annual convention of active members to be held in November 2024.

Timetable for Implementation

If approved, Mr. Little's term will begin on September 10, 2024.

Dear Commissioner Rosa:

Elizabeth Chetney, one of the three active teacher members of the New York State Teachers' Retirement System Board of Trustees, has resigned from the Board effective March 17, 2024. Ms. Chetney was last elected to the Retirement Board for a three-year term commencing February 1, 2024, by the annual convention of the active members of the System held pursuant to section 505 of the Education Law, on November 6, 2023.

Subdivision 3 of section 504 of the Education Law authorizes you, as Commissioner of Education. to fill the vacancy created by Ms. Chetney's departure until the next annual convention of active members to be held in November of 2024. Subdivision 3 provides in pertinent part:

"A vacancy occurring during a term in the case of a member elected from among the active members of the retirement system shall be filled, until the next annual convention of delegates, by the commissioner of education..."

I respectfully join with New York State United Teachers in urging your appointment of Donald A. Little III, an active member of the System from the Syracuse City School District, to fill this vacancy. A copy of his resume is furnished herewith.
