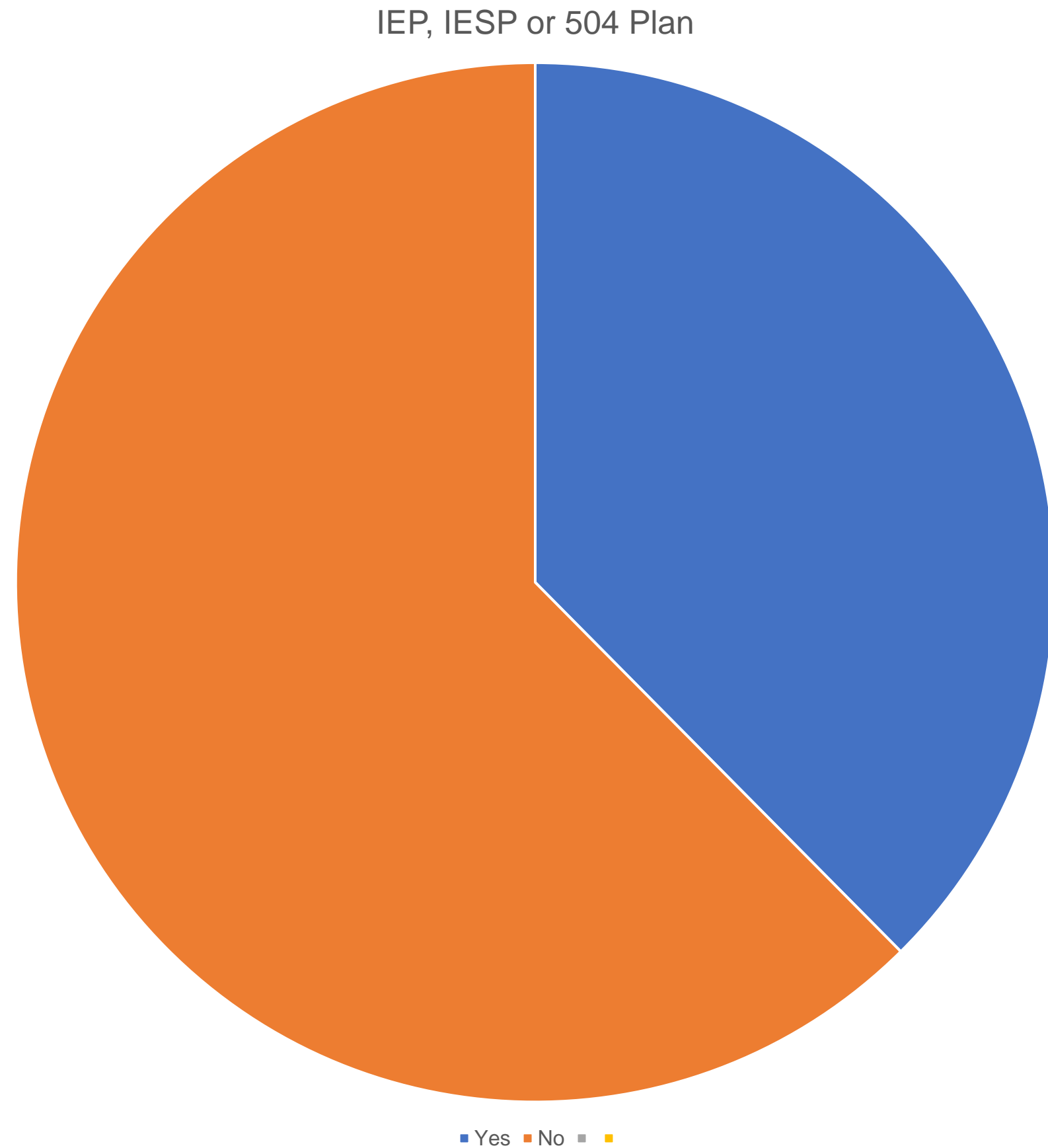

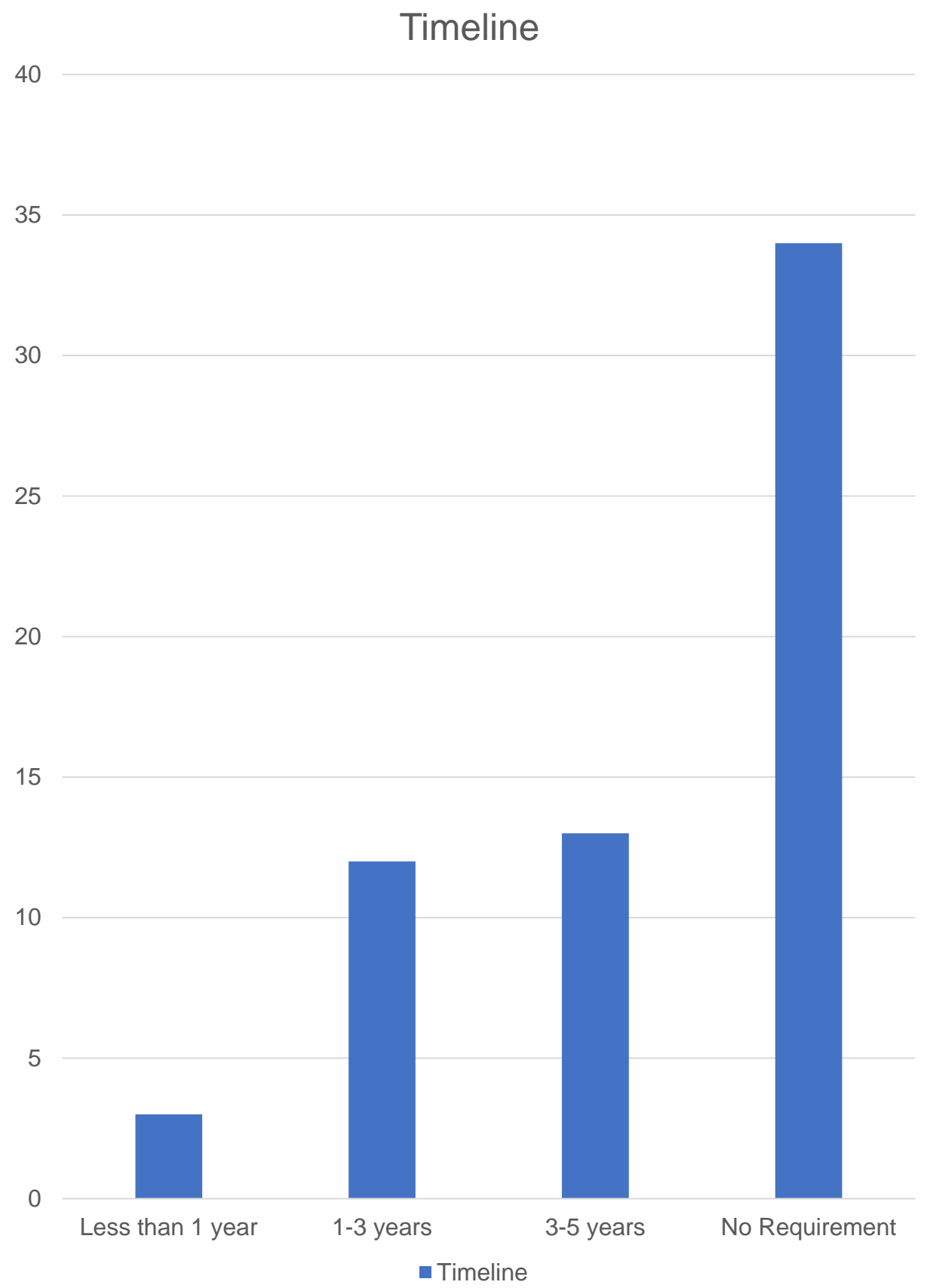

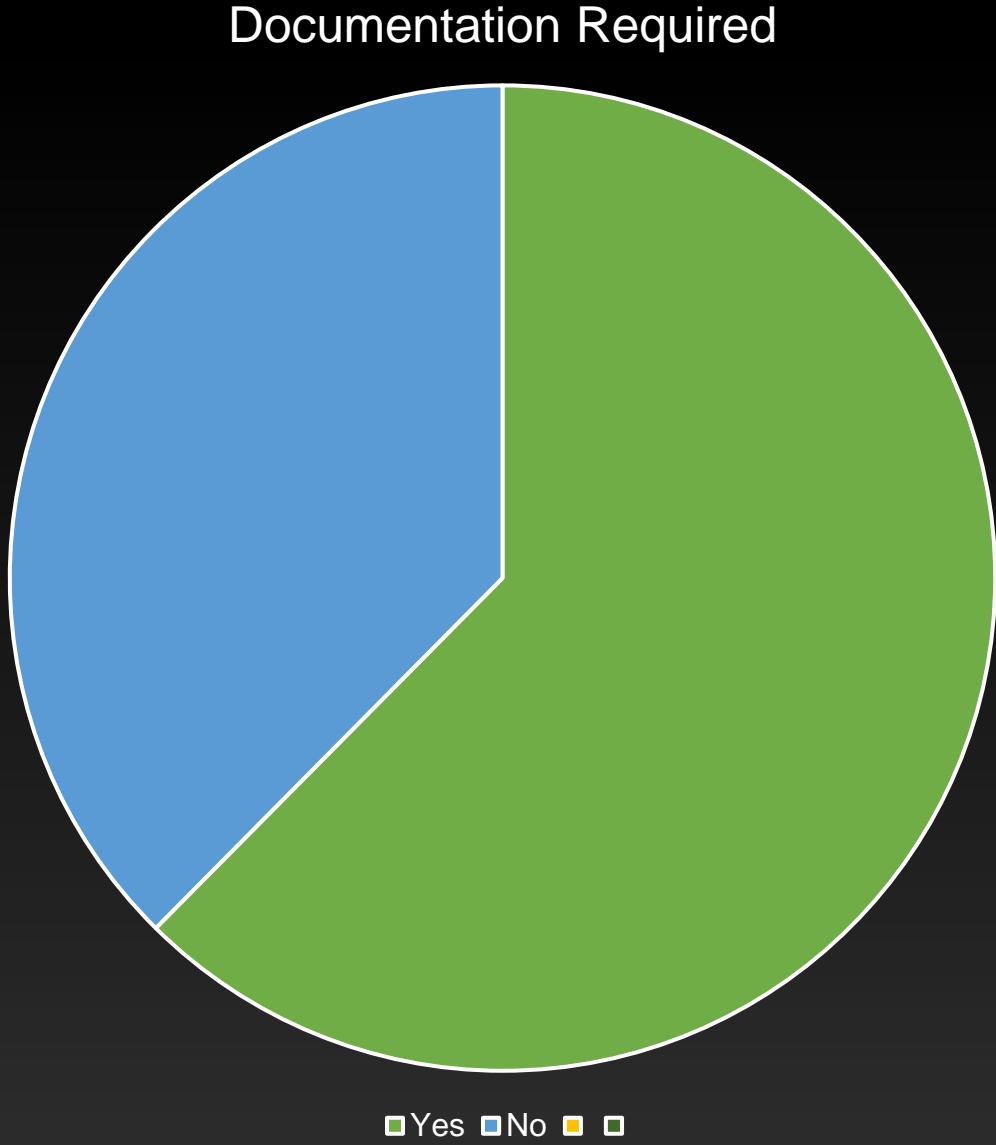
IEP, IESP or 504 Plan Required for Reasonable Accommodation



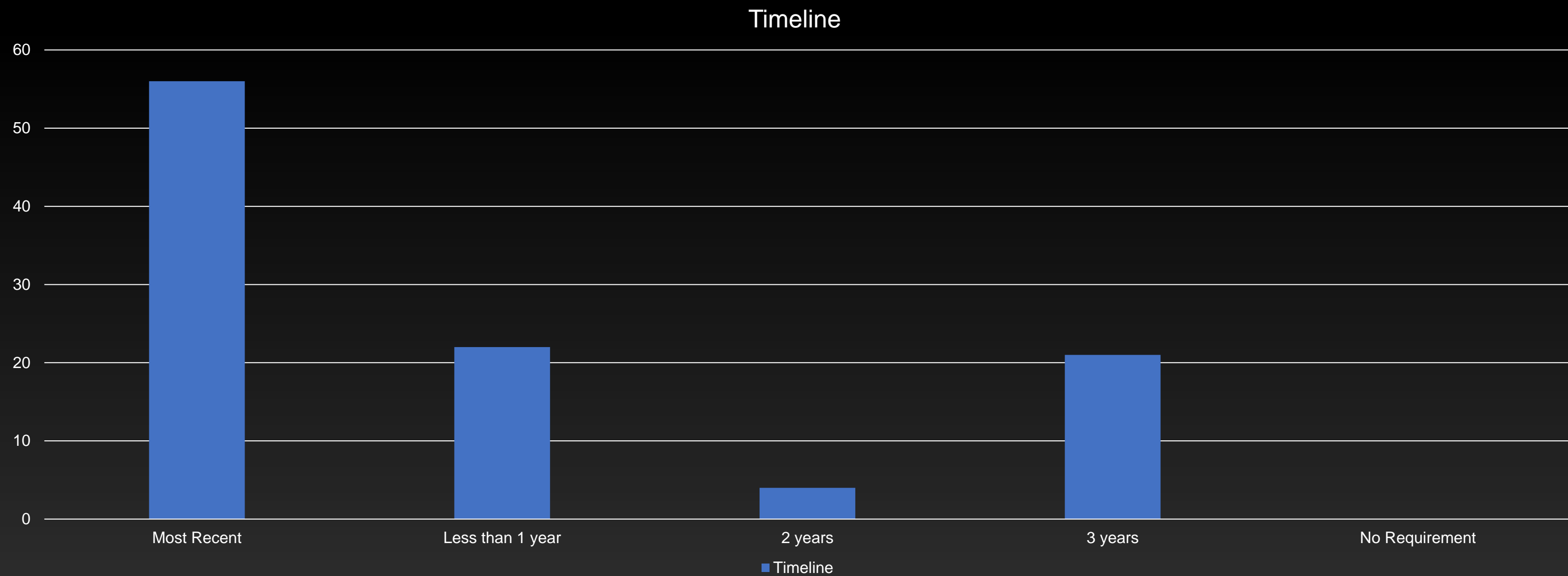
Timing of IEP, IESP or 504 Plan



Medical or Psychological Documentation Required for Reasonable Accommodation

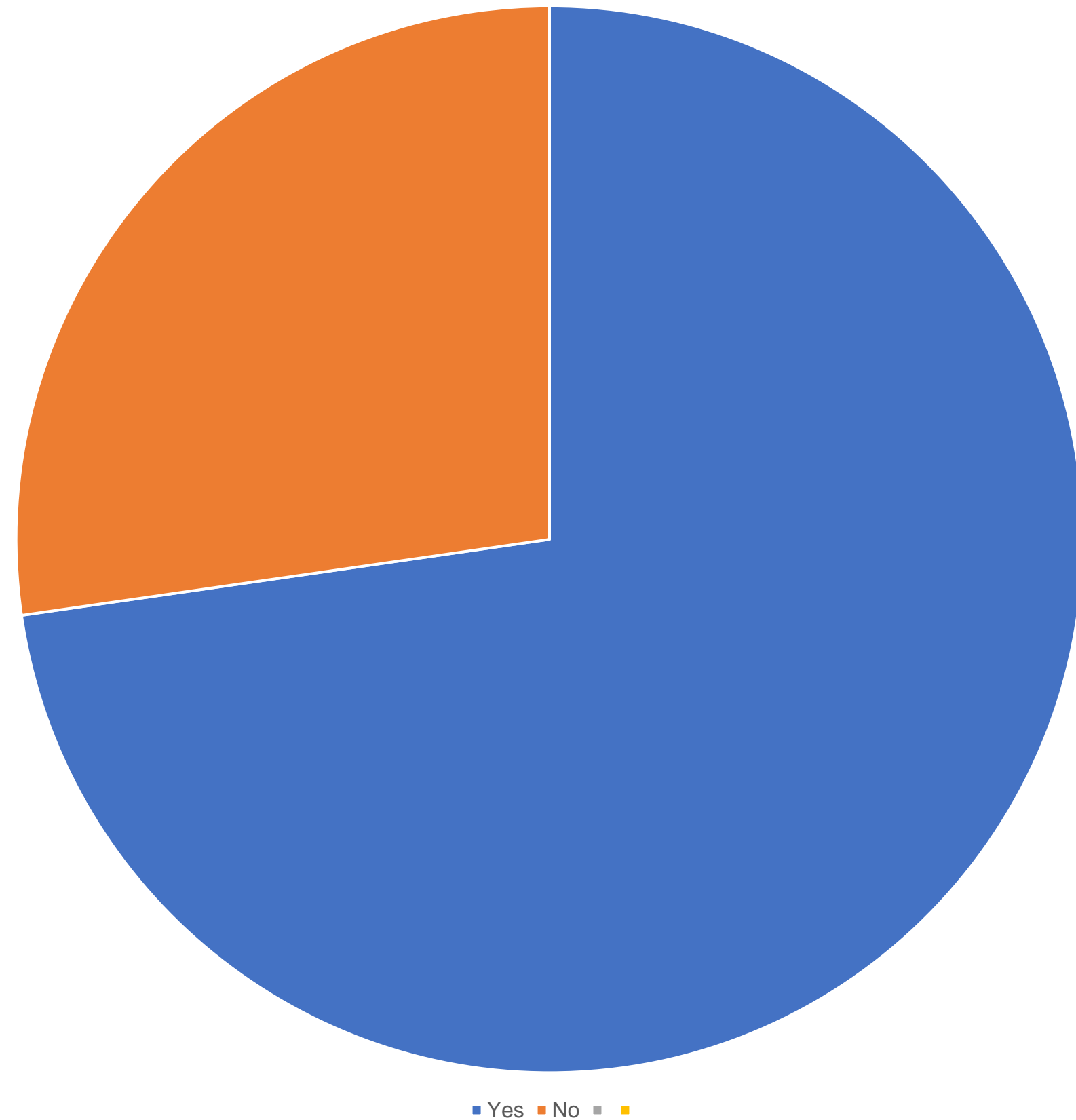


Timing of Medical Documentation

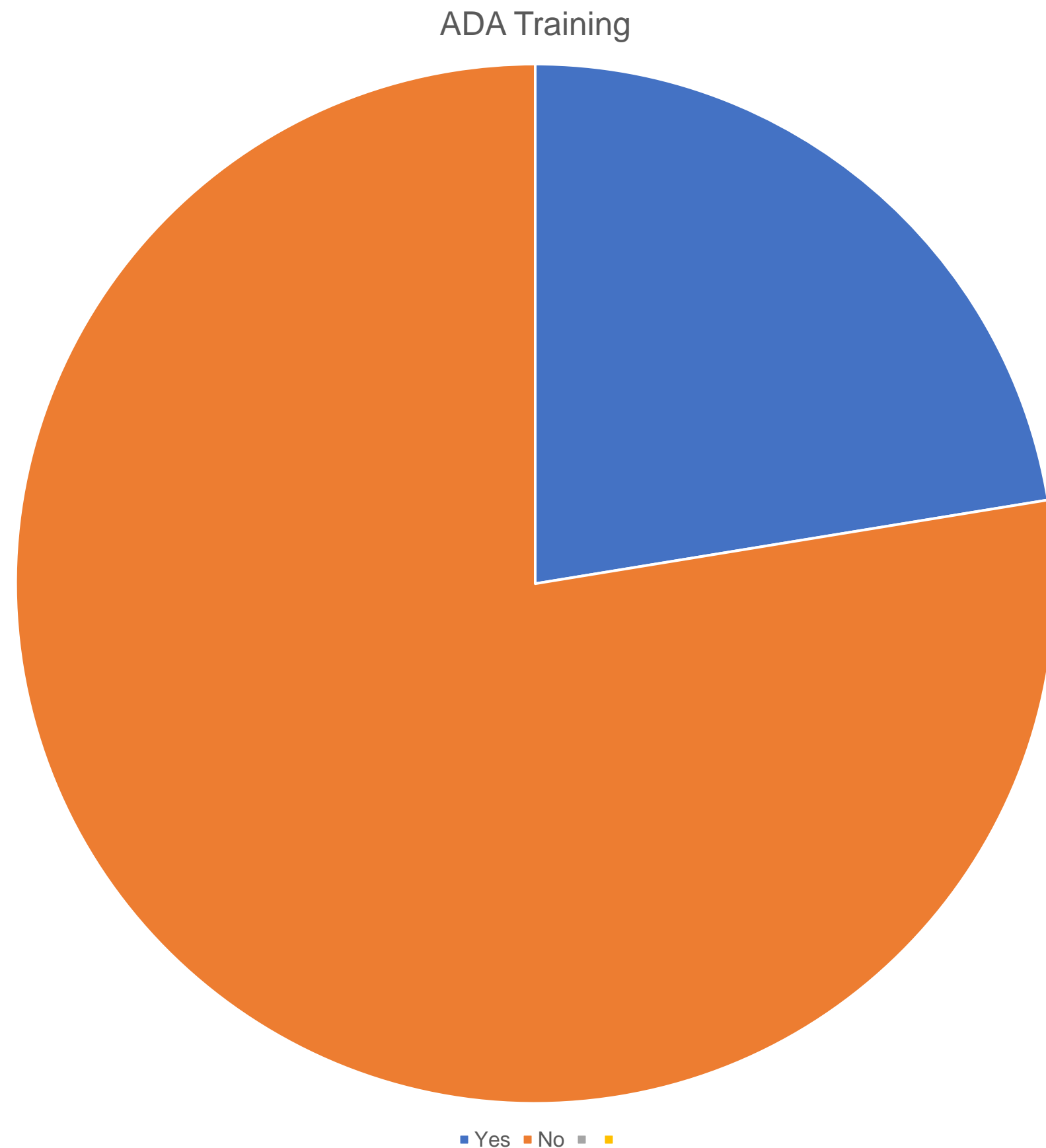
